She sleeps five with a large double berth in the bow and a pilot berth and two settee berths in the saloon. She has a roomy galley, an enclosed head, and comfortable lounging and dining area.

The original, short rig was done for conservative cruising. A taller rig with 700 square feet of sail area is under development, for those needing more drive in lighter airs or wanting to reach up and over the ocean swells in trade wind sailing.

This classic cruiser is a good choice for long-distance cruising with a small crew. She has the carrying capacity to be loaded up for voyaging and yet be roomy enough for a couple to liveaboard in comfort.
