Our fantail designs all take advantage of modern boatbuilding materials and the latest technology to create boats that will be long lasting and easy to live with.

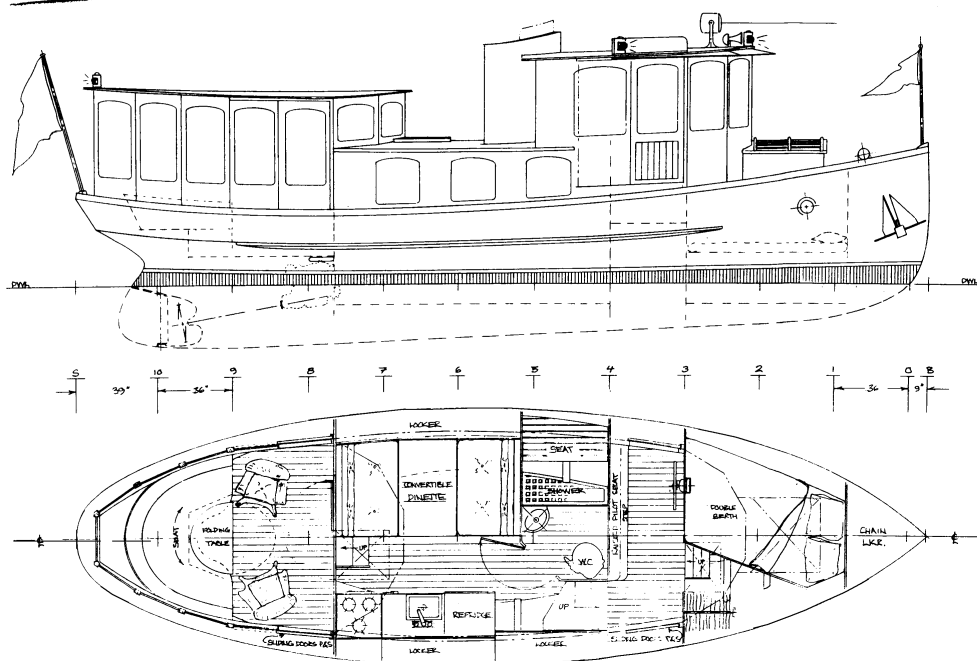
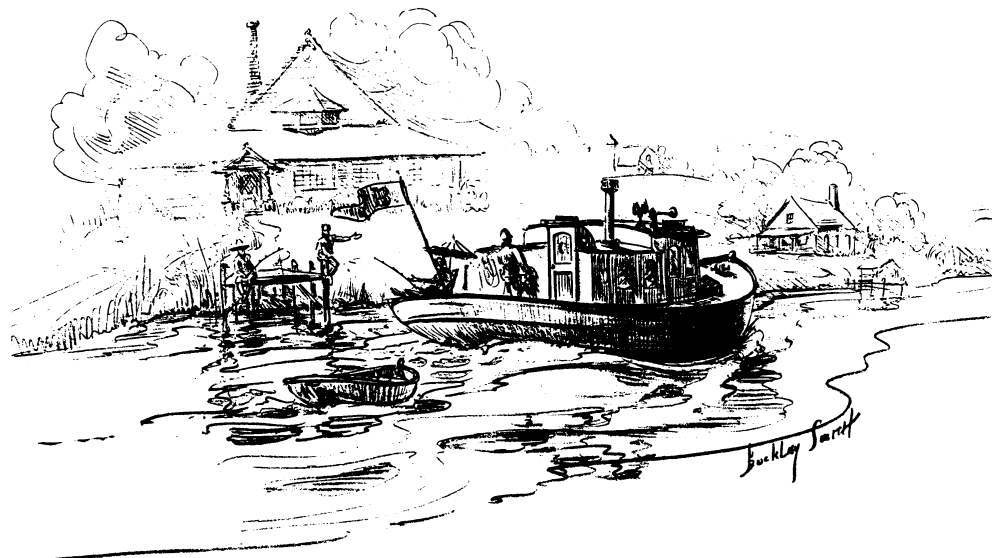
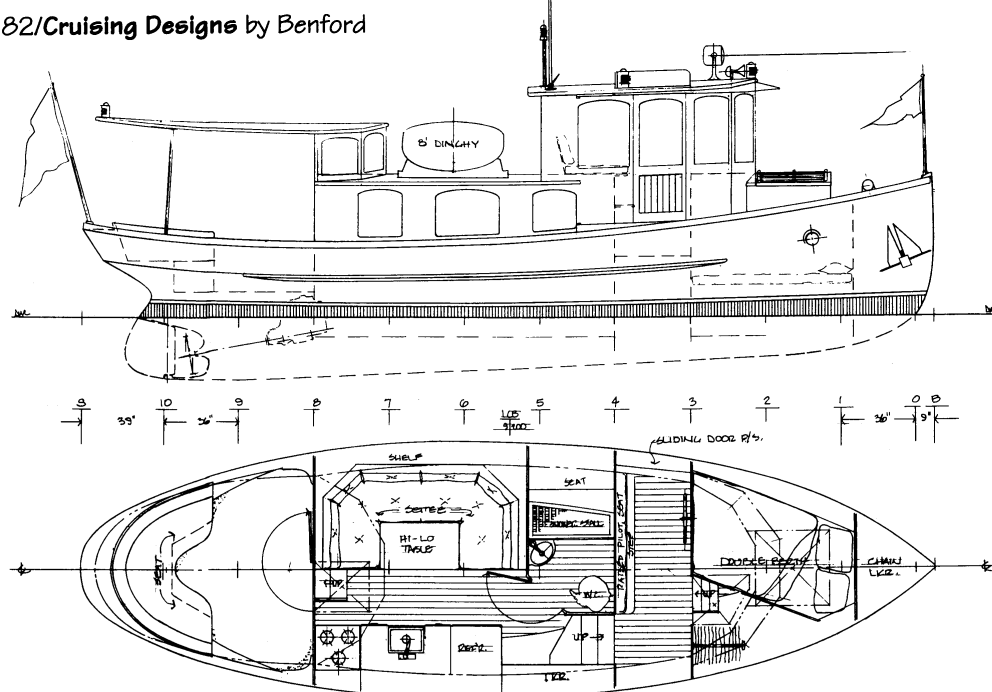

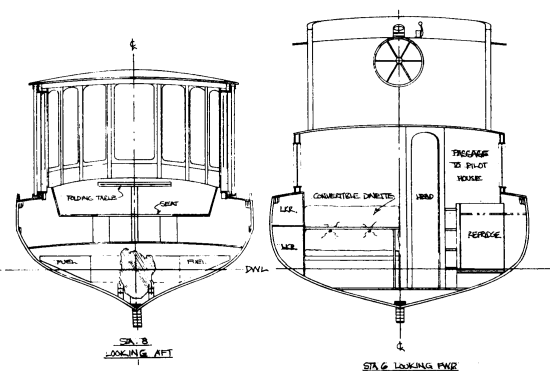
This 34-footer is intended for speeds in the 6 to 8 knot range, with 6 to 7 being quite economical. We've specified a 22½ hp diesel, even though she needs only about 12-15 horsepower to reach her top speed. This allows a margin for weather conditions or towing another vessel.

There's room for an 8 to 9' dinghy on the aft housetop, a large hold space under the pilothouse, giving room for all sorts of gear and stores on board. She'd make an excellent long range cruiser and liveaboard. Her styling marks her as a classic and will be appealing for years to come, making her a good investment. Don't own one if you don't enjoy meeting people, but if you're a bachelor....

The variations on a theme on this page are updated versions of the original 34' Fantail Yacht design done over a decade before. (The original 34 is shown in the artwork shown in the middle of the page and on page 70.)

The first one, which we call Solarium 34 #1 is shown at top of the page. She has an open after deck with curtains for inclement weather. She also has a longer dinette for eating and entertaining below decks.

Solarium 34 #2, shown at the bottom of the page, has a longer cockpit and shorter galley counter and dinette. The cockpit is enclosed making for the best year round usage. The greater cockpit length makes for better seating there. This is the area with a view almost as good as the pilothouse and is a favorite place for sitting around at anchor.
