60' Ketch Harambee & 60' Topsail Schooner



Harambee has proven to be a very practical and successful charter boat. Her galley, dining and navigation areas are in the deck house. She has an easily handled wishbone ketch rig. She sleeps nine in five staterooms, has two heads, two showers, a tub, and a utility room with washer and dryer. Laid out for chartering and living aboard, she's a deluxe yacht!

The handsome 60' Topsail Schooner is a deeper keel version of the 60' Ketch hull, with a flush deck. She's designed to sleep ten in five staterooms, and will make a comfortable world cruiser. Her romantic square topsail rig could be improved by modifying it like the Great Pyramid Rig we did on the 34' **Sunrise**, which would permit all the sail handling to be done from on deck.

These larger vessels are for construction by experienced builders, for they require thousands of man-hours and a substantial amount of money to make a success of these sailing ships.
